"When kids come to New Song and are saturated with Christ's love in this Christian community, I believe God will use it to change their lives," said Hosea Baxter, Professor of Urban Leadership of Crossroads Bible College.

Hosea was one of 40 people who attended two luncheons held at New Song's Brown County campus recently. Many of the first-time guests who attended were referral source partners, meaning people who work directly with at-risk families that could be referred to New Song.

"The luncheon events are part of a significant outreach we are making to referral sources throughout southcentral, central, and northeastern Indiana," shared New Song's Founder and Director, Bob Schloss. "While we don't have children living on campus yet, through this collaboration with other organizations we've been made aware of several kids who need our help. We trust that God's timing for us is growing nearer each day."

A large amount of energy and effort are being poured into these outreach activities by several New Song staff members. The groups and people that New Song is reaching out to include homeless shelters, social workers, school teachers, food pantry

staff, CASA workers, jail chaplains, churches, urban ministries, and social service agencies which support grandparents.

In the past two months, more than 50 organizations have been personally contacted by New Song and made aware that the ministry is now fully open and ready to serve kids in need. Another 250 referral sources and churches have also been contacted.

From the Heart A message from the Director

I still tear up when I'm alone in my study and think about boys and girls who feel abandoned by their dads, afraid in their neighborhoods, or are otherwise without hope. Even after these many years of New Song's development, the struggles and difficulties children face still make my heart grieve.

But when I'm out on campus and see the amazing setting that's been created for these kids, I feel so thankful to the Lord for what He has built.

As God's word states: "For He will deliver the needy when he cries for help, the afflicted also, and him who has no helper." (Ps 72:12)

It seems to me that God has blessed New Song with some of the most scenic property, amazing facilities, and incredible staff in all of Indiana. What He has created by His grace through 1,500 volunteers, 1,100 financial contributors, 100 business partners, and dozens of churches is truly remarkable.

What's needed now are the kids.

The way New Song receives children is unique. Children are placed directly into our care by moms who are struggling with challenging circumstances such as homelessness, addiction, incarceration, or other difficulties.

Custodial grandparents also enroll kids at New Song when they are no longer able to care for their grandkids as well as they'd like to. New Song empowers these parents and grandparents to give their kids a rare opportunity.

Our way of receiving kids outside of the juvenile court system is the narrower path, which can be more difficult. But it's a path we believe will holistically transform lives.

Finding at-risk kids we can help takes time as we build relationships with organizations and churches who know their families. And once these moms and grandmas learn about New Song, it's not easy for them to take the huge step of enrolling their children into our care.

We know, however, that there are moms and grandparents throughout Indiana who are dealing with very difficult situations and want to provide more for their children. We trust that as these parents and grandparents learn about New Song and see the hope and future God has prepared for their kids on our campus (Jeremiah 29:11), they will enter into a partnership with us to bless their children's lives.

Through our referral source partners we are finding kids we can help.

The situations surrounding many of these kids' lives provide a sobering picture of the children we will serve:


- A mom with four kids whose husband is incarcerated
